Dear Ms. Coates:

This letter presents the progress made by the PRP Group during October 2004 on RI/FS and IRAM Development at the Astoria Area-Wide Petroleum Site in Astoria, Oregon. This work is being conducted in response to DEQ Order No. ECSR-NWR-01-11.

#### WORK COMPLETED DURING OCTOBER 2004

Work was completed on the technical memorandum describing Phase 2 soil characterization and this technical memorandum was submitted to the DEQ on November 2, 2004.

Preparation of the Third Quarter 2004 (4<sup>th</sup> Round) ground-water monitoring report continued. Analysis of data for conducting an aquifer response evaluation began in October.

Storm water sampling for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2004 (4<sup>th</sup> Round) was completed in October. This sampling event included sampling from the new outfall installed during the storm sewer reroute conducted earlier this year.

A response to comments from the DEQ on the Level 1 Ecological Risk Assessment was submitted on October 18, 2004. Further evaluation of sediment characterization actions began after receipt of current sediment data collected in the slips at the Port of Astoria by the Columbia River Estuary Study Task Force (CREST).

Four permanent soil-gas monitoring points related to the vapor inhalation pathway assessment near the Port office were sampled in October.

A report from Fugro Geosciences describing the cone penetrometer/rapid oscillation screening tool (CPT/ROST) data, upland from the hydrocarbon seep in Slip 2, was received. These data were evaluated with respect to chemistry data collected in the same areas in order to reach some

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conclusions about the nature and extent of free phase hydrocarbons. The interim product removal activities associated with the hydrocarbon seep IRAM were continued in September. The absorbent boom was inspected three times during the month to confirm its proper operation.

Preparation of an IRAM work plan to support a new commercial development at the former Mobil/Niemi Bulk Plant and adjacent Port of Astoria properties was continued. This IRAM includes decommissioning of the underground storage tanks previously identified on the former Mobil/Niemi Bulk Plant property.

A meeting of the PRP Group representatives was held on October 12. A meeting between the PRP Group representatives and DEQ representatives was held on October 21.

#### WORK PLANNED FOR NOVEMBER 2004 AND DECEMBER 2004

The report describing the results of the ground-water sampling for the Third Quarter 2004 (4<sup>th</sup> Round) event will be completed in November. Evaluation of the tidal data and water levels measured in wells will be continued in November and December.

Validation of storm water data collected in October will be completed in November and a report describing the results will be prepared in December.

A follow-up to DEQ comments regarding the Slip 2 sediment investigation and ecological risk assessment will be prepared once the CREST analytical data for Slip 2 sediment samples are reviewed and a proposed approach is developed. Taku Fuji of Kennedy Jenks has discussed these matters with Paul Seidel of DEQ.

Analytical work and data validation of soil gas data will be completed in November and December, as well as planning for the next round of soil gas sampling.

Interpretation of CPT/ROST data will continue in November and December.

A report presenting the as-built diagrams of the installed IRAM at the hydrocarbon seep in Slip 2 will be prepared in November. The interim product removal activities associated with the hydrocarbon seep IRAM are scheduled to continue in November and December.

Tasks related to preparation of the Remedial Investigation Report for the site will continue in November and December. Activities related to the human health risk assessment will be initiated in November and December

Decommissioning of underground storage tanks at the former Mobil/Niemi Bulk Plant will be completed in November. The IRAM work plan for the commercial development will be completed in November.

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## PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED AND RESOLUTIONS

There are no problems requiring resolution in October.
